Figure 1. Daily Temperatures and Heat-Related Illnesses in Denton County, April 29, 2023- Present[‡]

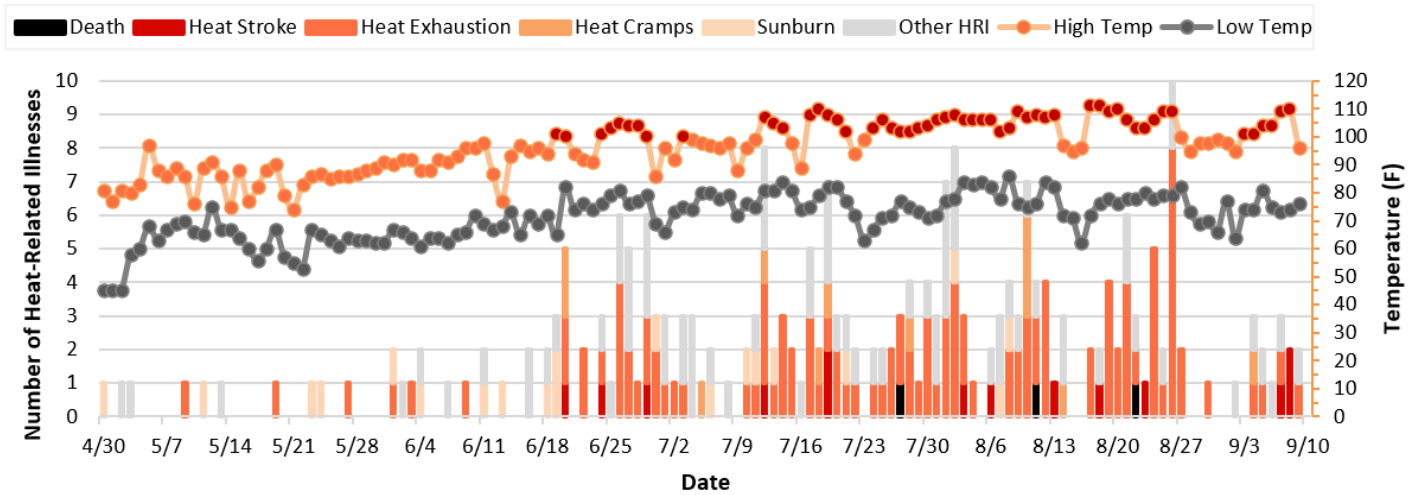
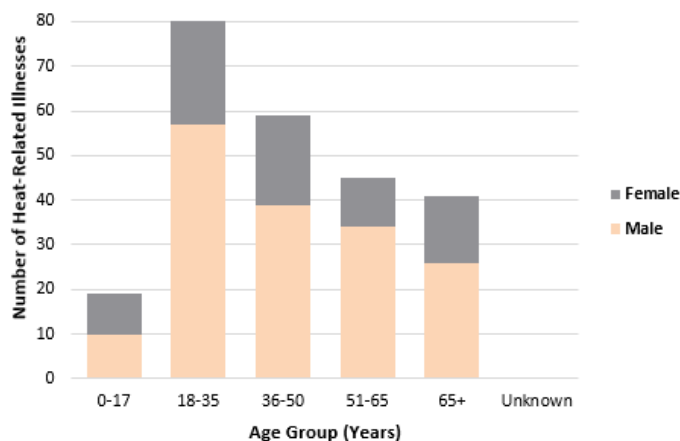


Figure 2. Heat-Related Illnesses in Denton County by Gender and Age Group
