Figure 1. Daily Temperatures and Heat-Related Illnesses in Denton County, May 12- September 7, 2019

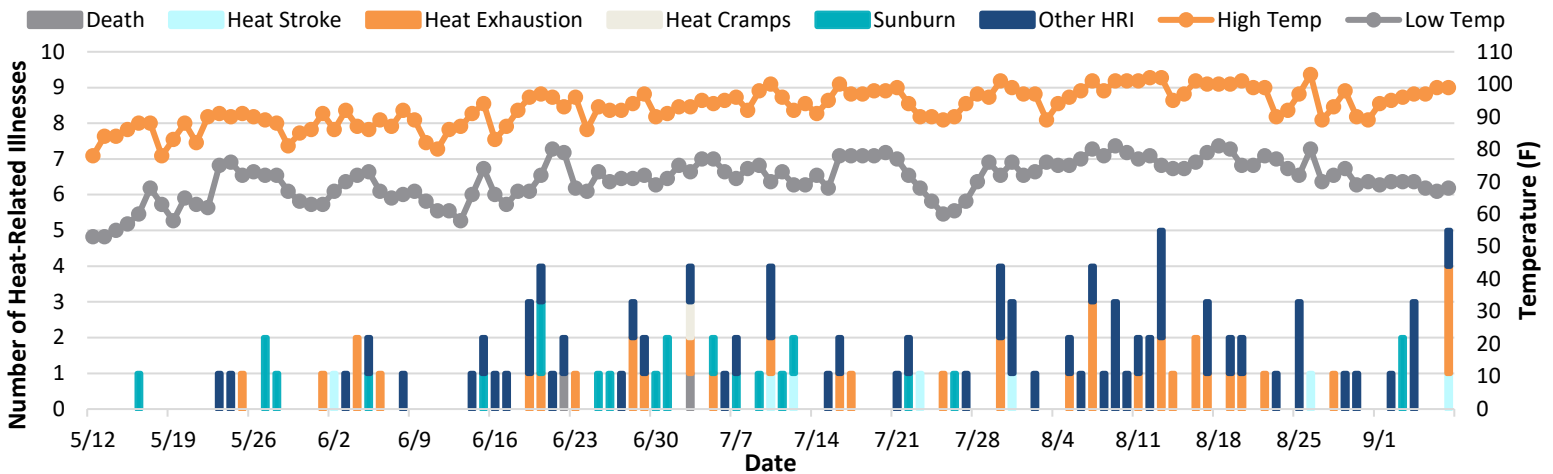
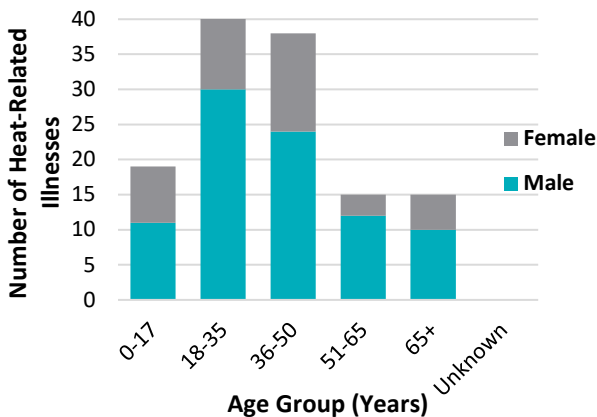


Figure 2. Heat-Related Illnesses in Denton County by Gender and Age Group
