**COURT ORDERED INTENSIVE SUPERVISION PROBATION**

These terms supplement your Court Ordered Terms and Conditions of Probation (regular probation) and, in the case of conflict, you are bound to follow the stricter Court Order.

The Court has placed you, the Respondent, on Intensive Supervision Probation (ISP). During the length of your ISP, you shall obey the following Court Ordered Terms and Conditions of ISP.

The intent of your ISP probation is to emphasize frequent contact and reporting with your Probation Officer, discipline, intensive supervision services, social responsibility, and productive work. See §59.007 of the Texas Family Code.

Beginning on \_\_\_\_\_, you shall abide by the following special conditions of ISP for a period of not less than three (3) nor more than twelve (12) months.

During that time, in writing and at the discretion of your Juvenile Probation Officer or the Court, you may be placed on any Phase of ISP. After three months but no later than twelve months – in writing and at the discretion of your Juvenile Probation Officer or the Court - you may be returned to regular probation.

At the end of your terms of ISP, you shall abide by your Court Ordered Terms and Conditions of Probation (regular probation).

You may participate in officially sanctioned and supervised school/religious/civic/social activities which occur after curfew hours with the prior permission of the Juvenile Probation Department or the Court.

You may seek work or work during curfew hours provided your parent, guardian, or custodian approves and gives prior notification to your Probation Officer of the name of the business, the business's address, and phone number of where you are seeking work or working, as applicable. If/when you are working, you must provide your Probation Officer a copy of your work schedule at least seven (7) days in advance of each work week.

You may fulfill your school, vocational training, and/or GED requirements; Probation rules; and obligations with your attorney before or after curfew.

**PHASE ONE CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION**

- A. Unless you are with a parent or other adult pre-approved by the Probation Officer or the Court, be at and inside your residence at all times.
- B. You shall contact your Probation Officer up to five times per week in the manner prescribed by and at the direction of your Probation Officer.

**PHASE TWO CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION**

- A. Unless you are with a parent or other adult pre-approved by the Probation Officer or the Court, be inside your residence no later than 5:00 p.m. each night until 7:00 a.m. the following morning.
- B. You shall contact your Probation Officer up to four times per week in the manner prescribed by and at the direction of your Probation Officer.

**PHASE THREE CONDITIONS OF PROBATION**

- A. Unless you are with a parent or other adult pre-approved by the Probation Officer or the Court, be inside your residence no later than 7:00 p.m. each night until 7:00 a.m. the following morning.
- B. You shall contact your Probation Officer up to three times per week in the manner prescribed by and at the direction of your Probation Officer.
