**COURT-ORDERED SPECIALIZED TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF PROBATION**

These terms supplement your Court-Ordered Terms and Conditions of Probation and, in the case of conflict, you are bound to follow the stricter Court Order.

**A. CURFEW/PROBATON OFFICER CONTACTS**

1. You have an “all hours” curfew, meaning you must be inside your residence at all times unless: (a) you are with a parent or other adult pre-approved in writing by your Probation Officer or the Court or (b) unless you have been provided by your Probation Officer, in writing, a more relaxed curfew schedule.
2. You may participate in officially sanctioned and supervised school/religious/civic/social activities which occur before or after curfew hours with the prior permission of the Juvenile Probation Department or the Court.
3. You may seek work or work before or after curfew hours provided your parent, guardian, or custodian approves and you give prior notification to your Probation Officer of the name of the business, the business address, and phone number of where you are seeking work or of your weekly work schedule, as applicable. See also Rule B9 below.
4. You may fulfill your school, vocational training, and/or GED requirements; Probation rules; and obligations with your attorney before or after curfew.
5. You shall contact your Probation Officer up to five times per week in the manner prescribed by and at the direction of your Probation Officer.
6. You shall give a copy of your Relapse Prevention Plan to your Probation Officer and you shall abide by your Relapse Prevention Plan during the entire course of your probation.

**B. SPECIALIZED TERMS OF PROBATION**

1. Immediately after this court hearing, contact your Juvenile Probation Officer.
2. Within twenty-one (21) days of this Order, schedule and thereafter successfully complete a Sex Offender Treatment Program approved by the Juvenile Probation Department. Any parent/guardian/custodian with whom Respondent resides must complete a parent component of the LSOTP treatment program.
3. If initialed by the Judge, Register as a sex offender pursuant to Chapter 62, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure and bring proof of registration to your Probation Officer within ten (10) days of registration and comply with all sex offender registration requirements.

4. If initialed, submit a blood sample or other specimen pursuant to Section 54.0405 and/or Section 54.0409 of the Texas Family Code within thirty (30) days of this Order to the Department of Public Safety for the purpose of creating a DNA record.
5. If found “true” of an offense under Sections 21.11(a)(1), 22.011 or 22.021 of the Texas Penal Code, within thirty (30) days of this Order, submit to testing designed to show or help show whether you have a sexually transmitted disease, AIDS, HIV, antibodies to HIV, or infection with any other probable causative agent of AIDS.
6. Pursuant to Section 54.0405 of the Texas Family Code, submit to a polygraph examination(s) at the direction of the treatment provider for the purposes of evaluating your treatment progress. Required polygraphs may include “instant offense” (which refers to the offense as charged and/or the offense as amended as part of a plea bargain), sexual history, maintenance, and monitoring polygraphs.
7. Provision regarding contact with the victim(s):

\_\_\_\_\_ Have no unsupervised contact with the victim(s). Only Approved Supervisors may monitor contact between the Respondent and the victim(s). The Approved Supervisors are

8. Have no contact with children younger than \_\_\_ years of age (the Prohibited Age), including members of your own household, unless an Approved Supervisor is present and supervising the contact. The Approved Supervisors are (CHOOSE ONE):

The Court cannot require a school district to separate you from children younger than the Prohibited Age. However, your parent(s)/guardian(s)/ custodian(s) must inform the school principal and bus driver of your restrictions for contact with children under the Prohibited Age. If you ride a school bus with children younger than the Prohibited Age, you must sit within the bus driver’s line of sight, as determined by the bus driver.

9. Do not accept or maintain employment which brings you into unsupervised contact with children younger than the Prohibited Age, unless approved in advance and in writing by the Probation Officer or the Court. For purposes of this Probation Term only, a person is deemed a supervisor if he or she is over the age of 18; has been notified of your Probation Rules as they pertain to contact with children under the Prohibited Age; and is physically present in the place of business at all times when you are working.
10. Do not supervise or participate in or attend any program that includes as participants or recipients any person who is younger than the Prohibited Age and that regularly provides athletic, religious, civic, or cultural activities unless approved in advance and in writing by the Probation Officer or the Court.

11. Do not access, possess, or view sexually stimulating or sexually oriented material or attempt to access, possess, or view sexually stimulating or sexually oriented material.
12. Do not visit a public pool, public park, or public attraction or other area where children under age 17 tend to frequent unless you obtain prior permission from the Court or your Probation Officer.

### **C. ORDERS AFFECTING PARENTS/GUARDIANS/CUSTODIANS**

1. Immediately after this court hearing, contact Respondent's Juvenile Probation Officer to discuss Respondent's terms of probation.
2. Provide transportation to the appropriate law enforcement agency for purposes of initial and annual sex offender registration if the Respondent is Ordered to register as a sex offender.
3. Provide transportation for the Respondent for each counseling session, polygraph examination, and/or mandated programs.
4. Attend counseling with or without the Respondent as deemed necessary by treatment provider.
5. Do not remove the Respondent or permit the Respondent to be removed from his/her State of residence for any overnight stay without obtaining a travel permit approved by the Court or the Juvenile Probation Officer.
6. Do not add people to the household without obtaining prior written approval from the Respondent's Probation Officer or the Court.
7. Report any missed counseling/treatment/polygraph/mandated program appointments to the Respondent's Probation Officer no later than the next business day.
8. Do not allow the Respondent to have contact with children younger than the Prohibited Age, including members of your own household, unless an Approved Supervisor is present and supervising the contact. The Court cannot require a school district to separate Respondent from children younger than the Prohibited Age. However, within three (3) business days of this Order and within three (3) business days of each time Respondent enrolls in a school thereafter, inform Respondent's Principal and bus driver about Respondent's restrictions for contact with children younger than the Prohibited Age and the reasons for the restrictions. Provide written proof to Respondent's Probation Officer that you have complied with this Order.
9. **Report any violation of these Orders to the Juvenile Probation Officer. The report must be made on the next business day. Parents shall not give the Respondent permission to violate these Orders.**
