



Avoid Toll Road Bills for Vehicles You No Longer Own

Have you sold a vehicle recently? If so, vehicles are required to be titled in the buyer's name within 30 days of the date of sale. Although the buyer is responsible for completing the title transfer through the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), the seller should also notify the DMV of the transfer of ownership by submitting a [Vehicle Transfer Notification](#) (VTN) online or by printing the VTN form and bringing or mailing it to your county tax office.

A VTN should be filled out regardless of who you sold it to – an individual or a dealer. This is important, because it's your proof that the vehicle was sold and transferred to a new owner. Failing to transfer ownership of a vehicle you sold could leave you liable for toll violations, tickets and sometimes even crimes committed with the vehicle.

The North Texas Tollway Authority (NTTA) is required by law to collect tolls from the person who was registered as the owner when the tolls were incurred. Completing a VTN as soon as you sell your vehicle will ensure that you are no longer responsible for the payment of tolls incurred by that vehicle after the sale.

If you receive a bill from NTTA for a vehicle no longer in your possession, please call 972-818-6882. Depending on the situation, you must have one of the following documents to clear your name from the tolls owed when you talk to an NTTA representative:

- Bill of sale from a dealership
- Vehicle Transfer Notification (VTN) receipt from the DMV
- Death certificate
- Divorce decree
- Police report (indicating a theft of the vehicle)
- Repossession notice from a dealership or financial institution

NTTA will accept any of the documents above, however, we cannot accept a handwritten bill of sale or another type documentation of sale, even if it's notarized.
