

DEFENSIVE DRIVING REQUIREMENTS:

- A defendant is allowed to take a Driver's Safety Course once each year (12 months) for the dismissal of a moving violation.
- If you have a commercial driver's license, or if the offense occurred in a construction zone with workers present or you were going more than 24 MPH over the speed limit, or speeding at a speed of 95 MPH or more, you are NOT eligible.
- The request for Defensive Driving must be made by the **plea due date of the ticket**.
- If the request for Defensive Driving is made by mail, it must be post marked on or before the plea due date of the ticket.
- The defendant must pay their court costs associated with their offense. Please contact the Court for details.
- The defendant must enter a plea of no contest or guilty and make a request to the Court for DSC. (You may use the DRIVER SAFETY COURSE REQUEST form available on this website. It MUST be notarized)
- The defendant must include a copy of his/her driver's license, proof of insurance, and a copy of TYPE 3A driving record provided by DPS with his/her DSC request.
- The defendant **must** provide the Court with an official COURT COPY as proof of completion of the Defensive Driving Class.

DEFERRED DISPOSITION REQUIREMENTS:

- If you have a commercial driver's license or if the offense occurred in a construction zone with workers present or you were going more than 24 MPH over the speed limit, or speeding at a speed of 95 MPH or more you are NOT eligible.
- The defendant must enter a plea of no contest or guilty and make a request to the Court for Deferred Disposition. (You may use the DEFERRED DISPOSITION REQUEST form available on this website. It MUST be notarized.
- The defendant must include a copy of his/her driver's license, and proof of insurance with his Deferred Disposition request.
- The defendant **must provide a written motion** at the end of his/her deferral period swearing that they have not committed any offenses during their deferral period.
- The request for Deferred Disposition must be made by the **plea due date of the ticket**.
- If the request for Deferred Disposition is made by mail, it must be post marked on or before the plea due date of the ticket.
- The amount of the fine and court costs **must be paid** at the time of your request. Please contact our office for details.
